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ArtsEmerson: The World On Stage Announces Global Arts Corps Residency Boston Theatre Community Offered Special Glimpse into Work-in-Progress set in the North of Ireland, by Company that Creates Performances in Conflict Zones

ArtsEmerson: The World On Stage welcomes Global Arts Corps for a four-week residency that will culminate in a work-in-progress presentation of their latest production, *Hold Your Tongue, Hold Your Dead*. The public is welcome to this free peek at Global Arts' newest work, with performances daily Sept. 25 – 28, 2013 at 7 p.m. in Emerson's Semel Theatre (Tufte Performance Center, 10 Boylston Place). Reservations are recommended, but not required, at 617-824-8400.

This is a powerful new play about surviving a troubled past only to face the unknown of a fragile peace. *Hold Your Tongue, Hold Your Dead* takes an ironic look at young and old struggling to find a voice in a country where not talking about the past has become something of an art. *Hold Your Tongue, Hold Your Dead* is a collaborative effort with actors from both sides of Northern Ireland's historic divide; fast-rising young Northern Irish playwright, Stacey Gregg; noted Irish Composer Jules Maxwell; and Global Arts founder/director Michael Lessac. Built from the actors' stories and memories, the production explores the cost of celebrating ancestors while banning the past, and probes the silence that affects a young vibrant generation ready to move on. The play features original songs, which will be explored live by the composer and company at each workshop production.

Global Arts Corps is a New York-based theatre organization that creates productions in former conflict zones around the world with actors who might have once looked down the barrels of guns at each other. Their previous work, *Truth in Translation* tells the story of South Africa's Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC) through the eyes of its young interpreters, who translated for both victim and perpetrator after apartheid's collapse. To date, the production has performed for 55,250 people, facilitated workshops for 10,545 participants and has played in 26 cities, in 11 countries on 3 continents. In each of these places -- From Rwanda to the North of Ireland, Zimbabwe to the West Balkans, South Africa to the United States and beyond -- audiences have expressed the desire to share their own stories, using their own humor and music. It is this reaction that inspired the creation of the Global Arts Corps and led to the start of the Northern Irish production. A documentary film chronicling Truth in Translation's creation and tour has recently been completed and was screened earlier this month at ArtsEmerson.

ArtsEmerson seeks to be at the forefront of discussions of social issues and civic engagement through theatre. This season, in addition to hosting Global Arts Corp, ArtsEmerson presents *columbinus*, a play about the Columbine shooting, *Mies Julie*, an examination of race in a post-apartheid society and *House / Divided*, a work that looks at the foreclosure crisis through the lens of *The Grapes of Wrath*. ArtsEmerson also continues work on *Common Ground*, a theatrical response to the seminal book of the same name by J. Anthony Lukas. With the blessing of Lukas' family, a class under the direction of Melia Bensussen and Kirsten Greenidge began an investigation of the book in 2011 and presented a workshop performance that December. It is expected that further work on the text will take place in the fall / winter followed by readings in community centers throughout the city.
