Boston-area bands have had little opportunity to perform in downtown Boston for decades, and this weekend of concerts will provide music lovers with a fantastic opportunity to see/hear some of the best Boston bands performing in a stunning building, rich with entertainment history. "The energy around the first weekend was really incredible," says Kieran Fallon, one of the ArtsEmerson music programmers who also plays in **The Nightlights**. "It just reaffirmed the need to keep creating these kinds of opportunities for bands to perform downtown."

Sidewalk Driver is high-energy, highly-infectious, hook-driven, Rock with a capital 'R.' The sound is modern but the heart of the band is more in line with 1970s rock culture, i.e. the Bowies and the Belushis of the world. Lead singer Tad McKitterick's voice has power and clarity, is expressive without falling off the pitch and is forceful without losing subtle moments. Guitarists Kate Murdoch and Jared Egan seamlessly weave crunchy rhythms with soaring solos while bassist John Smith and drummer A.J. Locke hold down the bottom end. The songs always come with some odd bent but not one that repels; rather, they welcome you to join in the celebration like a carnival barker hyping a freak show. Vundabar

Vundabar began two and half years ago as a lo-fi recording project shared between Drew McDonald and Brandon Hagen. Through an independent release, incessant DIY touring, and home spun PR Vundabar has been able to bring its sludgy jangly pop across the US as well as touring the club and festival circuit in Europe. Notable names they've played with include Mac DeMarco, Crocodiles, Brian Jonestown Massacre, and Bass Drum of Death. Their sound has been described as a cross between the Pixies and Weezer, with the pop sensibility of bands like The Smiths and Blur. The Novel Ideas

The Novel Ideas are a country folk quintet of friends from Massachusetts. Featuring the voices of three different songwriters, The Novel Ideas create a blend of pastoral, harmony driven, and plaintive Americana. They spent the past year touring nationally in support of their 10" single "Lost on the Road", featuring two new songs and marking the band's first effort as a five piece. In late 2014, The Novel Ideas headed to Los Angeles to record a new full length album, with producer Rick Parker (Lord Huron, Black Rebel Motorcycle Club), with a release date to be announced. Grey Reverend

Grey Reverend is the solo project of songwriter L.D. Brown. He began the project in 2005 while living in Philadelphia, focusing on guitar and voice as a primary means of expression. L.D's first years in Philadelphia as a writer were spent performing and recording with other artist such as Steve Gunn, Jack Rose, Chris Powell, and Cynthia G Mason. Signed to Ninja Tune/Motion Audio Records in 2009, and with two LPs "Of The Days" 2011, and "A Hero's Lie" 2013, Grey Reverend has toured the United States, U.K and Europe in support of these releases. Besides currently working as a guitarist and vocalist with "The Cinematic Orchestra" UK, L.D. has collaborated with a wide range of artist around the world. Bonobo, Fink, Lou Rhodes of Lamb, Cynthia G. Mason, members of Wilco, Tortoise, as well as many others. In describing Grey Reverend's sound, David Garland of WNYC radio in New York put it eloquently when he said "compelling songs with reverence for the grey, undefined areas of style, and without concern for standard musical, or social expectations." Anne Malin, a solo folk performer originally from the Midwest, has released music independently since the age of sixteen.
